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INTRODUCTION

This collection of devotions is offered for the use of Guilds to either open or close their meetings. The hymns, prayers and readings, which cover a variety of topics, are suggestions only and may be freely altered for local choices.

Prayers for local concerns, the Lord's Prayer and the Grace may be included. Sometimes it may be appropriate to begin with a period of silence or music.

A selection of additional readings and prayers, which may be found useful, are included at the end. Although most of the material has been personally written, adaptations and contributions have been included from 'New Every Morning' (BBC), 'New Parish Prayers' (Frank Colquhoun) and 'Clouds and Glory' (David Adam), resources you may wish to obtain for yourself.

Prayer: God, our Father, help us by your presence with us to worship you in spirit and in truth; that our consciences may be quickened by your holiness, our minds nourished by your truth, our imaginations purified by your beauty, our hearts opened to your love, our wills surrendered to your purpose; and may all this be gathered up in adoration as we ascribe to you glory, praise and honour, through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

Intercession: Through our meeting together here, may we increase in knowledge, deepen in understanding, grow in love and discover even more the richness of fellowship which we find in Christ and share together. Amen.

Reading: Psalm No 1

Hymn: Immortal, invisible, God only wise (*Hymns and Psalms no 9*)

Blessing: The God of hope fill you with all joy and peace in believing, so that you may abound in hope, and the peace of the Lord be always with you. Amen.

Prayer: Heavenly Father, give us a sense of your presence with us as we meet to share in this time of fellowship together. Grant us grateful hearts as we remember your goodness; penitence and the knowledge of your forgiveness as we remember our sins; joy as we remember your love; and enable us to lift up our hearts as an offering to you, through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

Intercession: Lord, in the world make us instruments of your peace.
Grant that we may seek
not so much to be consoled as to console,
not so much to be understood as to understand,
not so much to be loved as to love.
For it is in giving that we receive,
It is in pardoning that we are pardoned,
It is in dying that we are born again to eternal life. Amen.

(Prayers of local concern)

Reading: Psalm No 4

Hymn: Thy faithfulness, Lord, each moment we find, (*H&P no 805*)

Blessing: May you know that God is with you:
A light to your path,
A companion on the road,
A friend for your journey,
A sure presence and support at all times,
And the blessing of God almighty, the Father, the Son and the Holy Spirit be upon you and remain with you now and always. Amen.

Prayer: Lord Jesus Christ, your will for us is that through your spirit we should find wholeness of body mind and spirit. Sharing in the richness of your love and the fullness of your joy, lead us by your spirit into a life that is creative, compassionate and caring: a life that enriches our knowledge, increases our faith, and enlarges the boundaries of our love, through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

Intercession: Through our meeting together here, Lord, may we gain and deepen our vision of your kingdom as embracing the whole of our life within this world, and learn to discern the signs of your presence among us. Amen.

Reading: Psalm No 8

Hymn: With gladness we worship (*H&P no 19*)

Blessing: Christ, the Light of the World, scatter the darkness from our minds and hearts, and from before your path: and the blessing of God, Father, Son and Holy Spirit, be upon you today and always. Amen.

Prayer: Heavenly Father, we come together as members of your family, to offer you our praise and thanksgiving; to share in fellowship in Christ; to bring before you the needs of the world; to seek your forgiveness and for your strength as we offer our lives anew to your service, in the name of Jesus Christ our Lord, Amen.

Intercession: Grant us, O merciful God, to look with your eyes of compassion on the long travail of humankind. The wars, the hungry millions, the countless refugees, the natural disasters, the cruel and needless deaths, our inhumanity to one another, the heartbreak and hopelessness of many lives; hasten the coming of your kingdom, when nations shall be at peace, free from fear and free from want, with no more pain or tears, in the assurance of your love, and the security of your will, through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

Reading: Psalm No 12

Hymn: O worship the King (*H&P no 28*)

Blessing: The almighty Father be your strength;
The gracious Lord be your support;
The generous spirit surround you and shelter you. Amen.

Prayer: Enfold us Lord in your love
Surround us with your peace,
Encircle us with your power,
Enable us to be what you would have us be;
Empower us to do what you would have us do;
As you Lord are generous to us, may we be generous to others;
As you forgive us, may we learn to forgive others;
Lord, you give us life, you give us love, you give us yourself,
So may we give our lives, our love, ourselves to You;
Help us to choose the way of life and to lead others to Him,
our Lord Jesus Christ, who is the way, the truth and the life. Amen.

Intercession: Lord we pray that discord and anger may be taken away from our hearts and our communities, that broken relationships may find healing, that misunderstandings may be resolved, that our society be built on mutual respect, tolerance and a true sharing in each others lives; through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

Reading: Psalm No 15

Hymn: God is love, let heaven adore Him. (*H&P no 36*)

Blessing: May you hold in your hearts the assurance that there is nothing that can separate you from the love of God in Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

Prayer: God of grace, God of glory, guide us by your goodness, that we may walk in your ways, seek to do your will and worship you always; we give you thanks O Father, for the light that shines in our lives, through Jesus Christ our Lord, Amen.

Intercession: May the light that shines in us lead us to love, serve and care for those for whom life is a constant struggle with poverty, with pain, with personal hardship. Where there is darkness in our world, may the light of Christ radiate hope and healing. May the church be in the world as an instrument of Christ's light and of his life, ever seeking to discover

reveal and establish truth, peace and love to the glory of his name.
Amen.

Reading: Psalm No 16

Hymn: What shall I do my God to love (*H&P no 46*)

Blessing: Have your minds stayed on Christ that He may keep you in perfect peace. The almighty Father refresh you; the loving Saviour redeem you; the life-giving spirit restore you; and the blessing of God, Father, Son and Holy Spirit be with you, now and always. Amen.

Prayer: Grant us, O God, to see you in all the beauty of the world around us; the reflection of your own eternal glory. Open our eyes to all the signs of your love, and enable us to live that we may hold all created things in reverence, for Your sake, Amen.

Intercession: Awaken us, O Lord, to your presence, that we may walk in your world as your children. Give us reverence for all creation, that we may treat all living things with respect and gentleness and our fellow men and women with courtesy, through Christ our Lord, Amen.
Almighty God, from whom alone came insight and understanding; guide and prosper all who are engaged in scientific study and research, that through them knowledge may be increased and the life of humankind may be enriched, through Christ the Lord, Amen.

Reading: Psalm No 19

Hymn: Christ from whom all blessings flow (*H&P no 746*)

Blessing: Lord God, whose we are and whom we serve, help us to glorify you this day in all the thoughts of our hearts, in all the words of our lips, and in all the works of our hands, as becomes those who are your servants, through Jesus Christ our Lord, Amen.

Prayer: God, our Father, creator and Lord of all things, the earth belongs to you. Land, sea and air, all are yours, and so are the vast galaxies of space. Nothing is beyond your power, nothing is beneath your notice. For you are a loving father to your great family. You provide for our needs; you encourage and strengthen us with your spirit. May we always give you thanks, in the way we live as well as in the things we say. Forgive us Lord, in all that we have failed to do to uphold your truth and to share your love; Renew us and let your light and truth lead us; through Jesus Christ our Lord, Amen.

Intercession: Eternal God, may your spirit direct the passions and designs of our human lives, that the nations, their leaders and people may bring forth out of discord, a harmony more perfect than we can conceive; a new humility, a new understanding, a new hunger and thirst for righteousness; that your will may be done on earth as it is in heaven. Amen.

Reading: Psalm No 23

Hymn: All praise to our redeeming Lord (*H&P no 753*)

Blessing: Eternal God and Father, by whose life-giving power we are created and by whose love we are redeemed, guide and strengthen us by your spirit, that we may give ourselves to your service, and live each day in love to one another and to you, through Jesus Christ our Lord, Amen.

Prayer: Lord God, our Creator, keep alive in us a sense of wonder as we contemplate Your creation and our place within it. Fill our minds with the sense of mystery and help us to live with reverence for the whole of life and for all people; so inspire our senses with your spirit that we may touch with respect, look with excitement and joy, breathe with gratitude, and listen with appreciation and understanding. Fill every moment of our lives, Lord, with Your presence. Amen.

Intercession: Lord, the miracle of turning stones to bread, would be a minor miracle compared with turning the hatred of human hearts to love, indifference to compassion, greed to generosity, self-interest to self-offering; Lord, for these miracles of transformation we pray, so that in the midst of this world Your kingdom may come; Through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

Reading: Psalm No. 24

Hymn: My God how wonderful Thou art (*H&P no 51*)

Blessing: May you see life not flowing away from you, carrying away your hopes and your dreams, but coming as a stream towards you, bringing to you the life and the love of God, and filling your hearts with gratitude and new opportunities for the fulfilment of God's promises of joy to you. Amen.

————— 10 —————

Prayer: Almighty and eternal God, we bring to you the thankfulness of our hearts for all the enrichment of our lives that we receive through your love for us.

Forgive us our ingratitude and our neglect of sharing your love with others. We acknowledge that we find our greatest joy in worshipping and serving you. Lord, we ask that on those days when we are weary in body and spirit, that you will walk with us encouragingly; when we are uncertain and confused, lead us in your way; when we are fearful, embrace us with your love; when hope abandons us, show to us new horizons of life that lie ahead, and new opportunities that lie within us. Amen.

Intercession: On our journey, Lord, strengthen us to bring healing, comfort, companionship, love, joy and peace to those we meet along the road, For Jesus Christ's sake. Amen.

Reading: Psalm No. 27

Hymn: Great is Thy faithfulness (*H&P no 66*)

Blessing: May the Lord Bless you and make your life a breathing in of the fullness of His love, and a breathing out of the fragrant joy of gratitude. Amen.

Prayer: Eternal God, our Heavenly Father, this earth is filled with the beauty and the bounty of your spirit of love, amazing shapes and sounds, wonderful colours and textures given form in plants and animals, in the world of nature and the world of our humanity. We thank you for the beauty that we witness in the life of Jesus and for the bountiful love of His spirit. Amen.

Intercession: May the life that we see in Jesus invest and inspire the life of this world, transforming human greed to goodness, shaping our lives to the pattern of his care and compassion, overcoming our hatred and our hurtfulness, healing our divisions, creating harmony and understanding, so we may become members of the one universal kingdom of Christ. Amen.

Reading: Psalm No. 30

Hymn: Come let us sing of a wonderful love (*H&P no 691*)

Blessing: Heavenly father, in whom we live and move and have our being, we pray that you will so guide and govern us by your Holy Spirit, that in all the cares and occupations of our daily life we may never forget you, but remember that we are always walking in your sight, through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

Prayer: We thank you Lord, for the journeys we have made through life that have brought us to this time and place; we thank you for being with us and leading us through the shadows and the sunshine, times of sorrow and of joy.

We thank you for the discoveries we have made that have filled us with wonder and gratitude, especially the discovery of Your love, Your forgiveness, Your healing and renewing grace in Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

Intercession: We thank you Lord for those who have shared the journey with us, our friends and our families, and for strengthening our bonds of love. We thank you too Lord, for the opportunities that have been provided for us to share and to care for others, for whom the journey has been difficult; the lonely, the neglected, the sick and the suffering, the fearful, and those without hope. Bring them, with us, into the joy and new life of Your Kingdom. Amen.

Reading: Psalm No. 34

Hymn: Awake our souls (*H&P no 663*)

Blessing: O God, whose compassions fail not, give us grace so to recognise and receive your mercies that we may fashion our own lives after the pattern of Your love, and learn to give as freely as we have received. Lord, help us to understand what has been done for our redemption, so that Christ may live in our hearts by faith, and be proclaimed in our lives by love. Amen.

Prayer: Almighty God, to whom all hearts are open, all desires known, and from whom no secrets are hid; cleanse the thoughts of our hearts by the inspiration of Your Holy Spirit, that we may perfectly love you, and worthily magnify Your holy name. Through Christ our Lord, Amen.

Intercession: O God and Father of us all, we pray that in our society we may learn to seek first Your kingdom of truth, love and righteousness; to care for justice more than gain, and for sharing more than for domination; so that in all of us suspicion may give place to trust, and bitterness to goodwill, and we may live together in peace, expressing the harmony of our humanity. Amen.

Reading: Psalm No. 37

Hymn: O how blessed the hour (*H&P no 655*)

Blessing: Go forth into the world in peace; be of good courage; hold fast that which is good; render to no-one evil for evil; strengthen the faint-hearted; support the weak; help the afflicted; honour all men; love and serve the Lord, rejoicing in the power of the Holy Spirit. And the blessing of God Almighty, the Father, the Son and the Holy Spirit, be upon you and remain with you always. Amen.

Prayer: O Lord, whose mercy reaches to the heavens, whose faithfulness knows no end: Let the greatness of Your love be known to us, that we may worship You with wonder, joy and thanksgiving. Amen. Most merciful Father, who through your son Jesus Christ gave us a new commandment that we should love one another: give us also grace that we may fulfil it. Make us gentle, courteous and forbearing; and so direct our lives that we may look each to the good of others in word and deed; for his sake who loved us and gave Himself for us, Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

Intercession: Teach us good Lord, to serve You as You deserve; to give and not count the cost; to fight and not heed the wounds; to toil and not seek for rest; to labour and not to ask for any reward save that of knowing that we do your will; serving You in the comfort, care and compassion we minister to those in need; through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

Reading: Psalm No. 40 verses 1 - 11

Hymn: Through all the changing scenes of life (*H&P no 73*)

Blessing: The peace of God which passes all understanding, keep your hearts and minds in the knowledge and love of God, and of his Son, Jesus Christ our Lord; and the blessing of God Almighty, the Father, the Son and the Holy Spirit, be among you and remain with you always. Amen.

Advent Season

Prayer: Lord, we watch, we wait, we look, we long for your coming among us; dispel the darkness and awaken us to Your glory, that we may walk in Your light. Enfold us, Lord, in your love, encircle us with Your power, embrace us with Your peace; enable us to be who you would have us be, through our Lord Jesus Christ. Amen.

For the World: Lord, to the peoples of the world seeking freedom, justice and peace, make yourself known; Lord in our homes, to our families

and to all seeking to live in love, make yourself known; Lord, to all who are suffering and in pain, make yourself known; Lord, to those who are facing death and to those who watch and wait with them, make Yourself known; Lord, so make Yourself known that we may see the glory of God in every place, in every face, and know the peace of the Lord always. Amen.

Suggested Readings: Isaiah, 9. v2 - 7 or 2. v 6 - 7 and 11. v 1 - 9
Luke 1. v 26 - 38, 39 - 45, v 57 - 66 and 67 - 68,

Hymn: Joy to the World (*H&P no 77*)

Blessing: God, who ever comes to us, draw us to His love, draw us to His light, draw us to Himself; and the blessing of God Almighty, the Father, the Son and the Holy Spirit, be with us and remain with us always. Amen.

Christmas Season

Prayer: Lord Jesus Christ, may we come to worship You with the Shepherds, proclaim You with the Angels, seek You with the Wise Men, offer ourselves to You with Joseph and Mary and rejoice in Your love for us; Jesus, Son of Mary, You have come among us, to be one with us; we welcome You into our communities, we welcome You into our homes, we welcome You into our hearts.

Intercession: Lord, You could find no room at the Inn. We remember before You all who are homeless and can find no place of rest; especially refugees outcast from their countries; for street children and all children in care or victims of abuse in their own homes; for all who are lonely this Christmas, or who feel neglected; for those in hospital or terminally ill in hospice; Prince of Peace, give them all Your peace. Amen.

Suggested Readings: Matthew 1. v 18 - 24, 2. v 1 - 12
Luke 2. v 1 - 40, (divide up as appropriate)

Hymn: Love came down (*H&P no 105*)

Blessing: The wisdom of the wonderful counsellor guide you;
The strength of the mighty God protect you;
The love of the everlasting Father enfold you;
The peace of the Prince of Peace be within you;
Throughout this Christmas season and forever.
Amen.

Season of Epiphany

Prayer: O God, who by the leading of a star revealed Your Son, our Lord Jesus Christ, to the nations of the world, lead us to a clearer vision of Your presence, and the nations into ways of unity and peace; open our ears to Your call, and open our eyes to Your glory. Through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.
Lord, we give You thanks that You have called us to know You, that You have called us to serve You; Lord make us worthy of our calling. Amen.

Intercession: We pray especially for all who are called to the caring professions – for social workers and home helps, for doctors and nurses and all who work in hospitals and hospices; for all volunteers and charitable organisations working with children and the elderly; for counsellors and support workers. Encourage and support them with Your spirit of love and care. Amen.

Suggested Readings: Matthew 2. v 1 – 12, 13 – 18

Hymn: Brightest and Best (*H&P no 123*)

Blessing: Arise shine for your light is come; the glory of the Lord is risen upon you, Christ be a bright flame before you, a guiding star above you, a kindly shepherd behind you, and a supporting strength beneath you; And the blessing of God, Father, Son and Holy Spirit be with you always. Amen.

Season of Light

Prayer: Almighty God, give us grace to cast away the works of darkness, cleanse and deliver us from all our sins, confirm and strengthen us in all goodness, and lead us in the way of eternal life; through Him who is the way, the truth and the life, Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

Intercession: Lord, we remember before You our faults and failings, knowing Your passion to heal and forgive us; we fail to live up to our ideals; we are often too concerned about material things, and often not concerned enough; we do not put our trust in You, but trust in our own strength alone; we neglect to care for your world, and despoil it by our selfishness, greed and indifference; we create discord, division and destruction in our human relationships; Lord, more and more reveal Your beauty, goodness and love to us; renew our life by Your fulfilment in us. Amen.

John 1. v 1 – 9

Hymn: Hark my soul (*H&P no 521*)

Blessing: Walk in the light of Christ, that you may become children of light, and the peace of the Lord be always with you. Amen.

Holy Week

Prayer: We adore You O Christ, and we praise You because by Your cross and passion You have redeemed the world.
Holy Lord God, You did not spare Your own Son, but gave him up for us all. We remember His obedience to Your will, even to death upon the cross. We remember His forgiveness of those who crucified Him and nailed Him to the cross. We rejoice in Christ's love for the world which nothing could destroy. We rejoice in the victory over all evil and the power of death. We confess to You, God our Father, how often we avoid the discipline and pain of self-surrender; how often we fail to see the cross in the needs and sufferings of others; how often we deny the cross by asserting instead of giving ourselves. May we so love in loving others that in them we may find You and live in You, Christ our Lord. Amen.

Blessing: Thanks be to you, our Lord Jesus Christ, for all the benefits which you have given us, for all the pains and insults which You have borne for us. Most merciful redeemer, friend and brother, may we know You more clearly, love You more dearly and follow You more clearly, day by day. Amen.

Season of Easter

- Prayer: The Lord is risen; He is risen indeed. Eternal God and Father, by whose power our Lord Jesus Christ was raised from the dead: With the whole company of Your people in heaven and on earth, we rejoice and give thanks, that He who was dead is alive again and lives for evermore; that He is with us now and always; and that nothing can separate us from Your love in Him; that He has opened the way to Your kingdom and brought us the gift of eternal life; to You be all praise, glory, honour and thanksgiving, almighty and everlasting God, in time and for all eternity. Amen.
- Intercession: Lord, be present with Your love to those in this world who are lonely, those who feel rejected, those who are broken-hearted, those whose hopes have died, those bearing suffering and pain, those who are coming to the end of their journey in this world; help us, Lord, to walk with these and with all who are downcast and fearful, and as we walk may we know Your presence very near. Amen.

- Blessing: Receive into Your keeping, O God, ourselves and all those we love, and teach us in life and death to put our trust in You, our strength and redeemer. Amen.
 Risen Lord, who on the first Easter day drew near Your two disciples on the Emmaus road, and at evening stayed with them in their village home: Be our unseen companion along the daily journey of our life, and at the ending of the day come and abide with us in our dwellings; for Your love's sake. Amen.

Ascension Day

- Prayer: We give You thanks and praise our Lord Jesus Christ, that in Your ascension You elevated and enhanced our human nature, so that we shall be as You are, filled with love and beautified by the truth - true children of God, the Father to whom with You and the Holy Spirit be all honour and glory. Amen.
- Intercession: Give to us, O God, a vision of Your world as love would make it; a world where the weak are protected and none go hungry; a world whose benefits and beauty are shared, so that everyone may enjoy them; a world whose different people and cultures and religions live together with tolerance, mutual respect and reverence; a world where peace is built with justice, and where justice is fired with love; so this world and all within it delight in Your heart and glorify Your name. Amen.

- Hymn: There's a light upon the mountain (*H&P no 246*)
- Blessing: The risen and ascended Lord be with you to uplift you, to inspire you, to guide you, to give you a glimpse of His glory and to kindle in you the vision of His eternal kingdom. Amen.

Season of Pentecost

- Prayer: O God, we pray that as the Holy Spirit came in wind and fire to the apostles, so he may come to us, breathing life into our souls and kindling in our hearts the flames of love; through our Lord Jesus Christ. Amen.
 Come Holy Spirit of God, restore our lives which without You are dead; kindle the hearts which without You are cold and dull; enlighten the minds which without You are dark and blind; fill the church which without You is an empty shrine; through of Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.
- Intercession: Lord God, Creator and Father of us all, you have made of one blood people of all races and nations of the earth; increase among us the spirit of sympathy and understanding, of tolerance and goodwill; that the prejudices, arrogance and pride which cause division between those of different race, creed or colour may be done away, and all peoples may live together in unity and peace; through our Lord Jesus Christ. Amen.

Prayer for Local Concerns

Suggested Readings: Acts 2. v 1 – 47 (as required)

Hymn: Come down O love divine (*H&P no 281*)

Blessing: O God, by Your spirit dwelling in our hearts, may we know this day the joy of Your presence and be given wisdom and strength for every task; defend us, O Lord, with Thy heavenly grace, that we may continue Thine for ever, and daily increase in Thy Holy Spirit more and more, until we come to Thy everlasting kingdom. Amen.

Season of All Saints

Prayer: Almighty God, from whose love neither death nor life can separate us: with the whole company of the redeemed in heaven and on earth we praise and magnify Your glorious name, Father, Son and Holy Spirit, one God, blessed forever.

Blessed be the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ; by His great mercy we have been born anew to a living hope through the resurrection of Jesus Christ from the dead, and to an inheritance which is imperishable, undefiled, and unfading, reserved in heaven for all who put their faith in God. Amen.

Intercession: Father, we pray for all who are finding the last stage of their journey a trial of their physical and spiritual stamina: those who are seriously ill, those who are lonely, those who are dying; keep them in the fellowship of all the faithful souls on earth and in heaven and bring them renewed and whole into Your eternal kingdom. Amen.
